Greater Lansing Automotive Sites

1. **Michigan Historical Museum**, 702 W. Kalamazoo St. Surrounding visitors with Michigan history from prehistoric times through the late-twentieth century, 26 permanent galleries on four levels include a walk-through copper mine, one-room school-house, 1957 Auto Show, S&H Greenstamps Store, and more. Admissions free. Hours Monday through Friday, 9-4:30; Saturday, 10-4.
2. **Durant Park** Saginaw between Capitol and Washington Ave. This was a gift from W.C. Durant, (founder of General Motors and Durant Motor Car Company), to the City of Lansing in 1920.
3. **REO Mural** - On the north side of Quality Dairy 1410 S. Washington Ave. Depicting the REO clubhouse in the REOTown district. REO was the second automobile manufacturing company started by R.E.Olds.
4. **R. E. Olds Transportation Museum**, 240 Museum Dr. A tribute to the auto industry, and one of Lansing's most prominent citizens-Ransom Eli Olds. The very first Oldsmobile, built in 1897, is on display along with antique REOs, Stars, automotive advertising and memorabilia.

Impression 5 Science Center, 200 Museum Drive. A hands-on learning experience that encourages visitors to discover and explore the world they live in. Hours: Monday through Friday 10-5. Admission charged.

Michigan Museum of Surveying, 220 Museum Drive. This museum presents the history of settlement and scientific innovation through the history of land measurement. Monday through Friday 9-4. Donations appreciated.

5. **Clara's Station**, 637 E. Michigan Ave. Located in the historic Michigan Central Railroad station housing a collection of Lansing and Michigan antiques and a sixteen page menu make this a stop to make!
6. **McDonald's** at Frandor has a wealth of Oldsmobile and automotive memorabilia lining its walls.
